ear Parents/Carers,

Now that we are almost at the half term break, the last seven weeks seem to have flown by! The children have loved being in school and the staff have really enjoyed being able to teach in person in school. Thanks to all the safety precautions in school and thanks to everyone, staff, parents and children being careful and sensible, we have still only had one case in school and very few families affected by members of the household having to isolate. members of staff have isolate. had to the teachers have seamlessly transitioned into virtual learning and live lessons on Teams following the timetable. This has meant little verv disruption the to children's learning and enjoyment.
