On my head I wore a beret. Mrs Inkster, Mrs Flanagan and Mrs Marston were all dressed up too.

There were two ladies at the museum, Vivian and Rosemary who took us to the education room. They told us lots of facts about evacuees. They got us to retell the story of 'Joan' who had been a real life evacuee to Bewdley in the war. We got to see lots of artefacts from the war and we even got to go and sit in an air raid shelter. It was a large Anderson shelter built on the site of the museum to give protection for people who worked in the bank in Bewdley during the war. It was long, made of metal and cold. It had benches for us to sit down on. It wouldn't have been pleasant to stay in it for too long! We learned that people would have spend whole nights in the shelters to protect themselves from the bombs.

There was a lot of rationing during the war because everything was in short supply. We learnt how to make rag rugs using small pieces of scrap fabric. Anjali and my rug was so good Mrs Marston has brought it back to school. It is on display in Upper II if you would like to look at it.

As we clambered back on the coach I took one last look at Bewdley Museum, 'I'll be back' I whispered.
