











Pre-Nursery






The children enjoyed doing some mark making using the iPads and the marker pens, they did very well at identifying the different colours they used for their pictures.

It has been another busy half-term for Form I. We were given our script for our Nativity during the holidays and have been learning our lines ever since! We loved doing it and were all very proud of the shows that we did! Thank you to all the parents who helped with costumes and practising the songs at home. It was lovely to see so many of you at the performance! We all felt a bit like the grumpy donkey after all that hard work, but it was worth it! We managed to make it to Bethlehem in time for the birth of Jesus.

We paid our respects to two other important occasions earlier in the term: Remembrance Day and Diwali. Mrs Bansal organised a very energetic and enjoyable Bhangra Dance workshop. Our PE lessons have been used to celebrate dance. There are 5 key sequences in dance: jump, turn, travel, gesture and stillness. We choreographed moves to the James Bond theme, by the end of which Form I felt shaken but not stirred...

We had our annual trip to the Lichfield Garrick Theatre to watch the pantomime "Jack and the Beanstalk". In the final week of term, we had our Christmas party and some of us went to the Christmas movie night experience!









As part of our Geography topic, "Beyond the Magic Kingdom: what is the Sunshine State really like?" Lower II have been researching the lifecycle of the leatherback turtle and how this creature is at risk from natural and human hazards. The children discovered that of the seven species of sea turtle in the world, five are found in the waters around Florida. This means that beaches such as the one at Melbourne on the east coast are a critical link in their life cycle, as this is where they will come ashore to lay their eggs.

Through research and investigation, the children discovered that the leatherback turtle were an endangered species due to Florida being such a popular destination for beach holidays and turtles come ashore to lay their eggs at the warmest time of the year on theses beaches. This meant that conflicts can arise between the needs of the turtles and the needs of humans. The children discovered that a popular way of raising awareness of the plight of the turtle in America is via car bumper stickers.

The children designed their own educational and persuasive bumper stickers with eye catching designs and a short, simple and creative statement explaining why action is so important.









As part of our Stone Age topic this term, Form II have been creating some exciting pieces of artwork in lessons with Mrs Hatton. Building Stonehenge out of custard creams was a highlight!

To end the term, pupils went on a trip to The New Walsall Art Gallery. The resident artist, Rob, talked to the children about the different types of artwork in the gallery and inspired them to make a clay sculpture animal based on the Stone Age.

First, pupils sketched animal heads and details using the artwork on the walls for inspiration. They then went into the activity room to mold their animals.

After lunch, we were invited to walk around the different galleries and experimented with plasticine, making a sculpture of a portrait. Everyone thoroughly enjoyed the day and below are some photos of Form II in action with their creations.







Finally, a model of Hogwarts capped off a truly magical visit. The model had been covered in snow and felt very in keeping with the weather outside.














